**Online Registration:** Online registration is now available. Go to [aeoe.org](http://aeoe.org) and click on Register. Same deadlines apply to online registration.

**Registration Dates and Deadlines:** Postmark your registration by April 3, 2010 and you will get the early registration rate of \$150. Postmark between April 4 and April 17, 2010 and it will cost \$175; after April 17, 2010 no mail-in registrations will be accepted, walk-in registration only at \$205, paid on site. Please contact Helen to see if space is available - space not guaranteed for walk-ins. Get those registrations in early!

**Family rates:** Available for non-participating family members, contact the Conference Registrar (see above).

**No Meals/No Lodging Rate:** A limited number of special registrations will be accepted. THIS RATE DOES NOT INCLUDE MEALS, LODGING OR CAMPING. Day rates are \$100 for registration received by April 17<sup>th</sup> and \$130 on-site registration. You may attend workshops and events, **including evening events**, but you **must** stay in off site accommodations and provide your own meals.

**Payment:** Checks, Money Orders or Purchase Orders accepted. If you are paying with a P.O., it must accompany your registration form. If there is a time concern, please contact the Conference Registrar (see above).

**Housing:** Included in the basic conference cost, housing is typical camp dorm style with bedding not included. Most cabins are about a 10 minute walk from the main dining hall area, but you can drive in to drop off your things and park. Bring a sleeping bag or sheet or blanket and pillow. Earplugs are a plus if someone in your cabin snores! Camping is on flat open lawn areas close to the dining hall—some areas with ocean views near the path to the beach. Bring a tent, but cooking on site is not allowed. Premium motel-style housing is available in the conference center adjacent to the dining hall for an extra charge. (See registration form).

**Meals:** Meals will be served buffet/cafeteria style. All meals will be vegetarian, with meat or vegan options (see registration form). Those with more specialized diets need to bring their own food. Coffee, teas, and other beverages and snacks will also be available in the dining room. No food/lodging folks will not be allowed in the dining room during meals.

**Parking:** Parking is very limited and we strongly encourage carpooling! To encourage you further, there will be a \$5 parking fee (for future scholarships), which will be waived if you carpool with at least 3 people per vehicle. Pay parking fee at registration. Those carpooling will also receive a raffle ticket to win one of many great prizes.

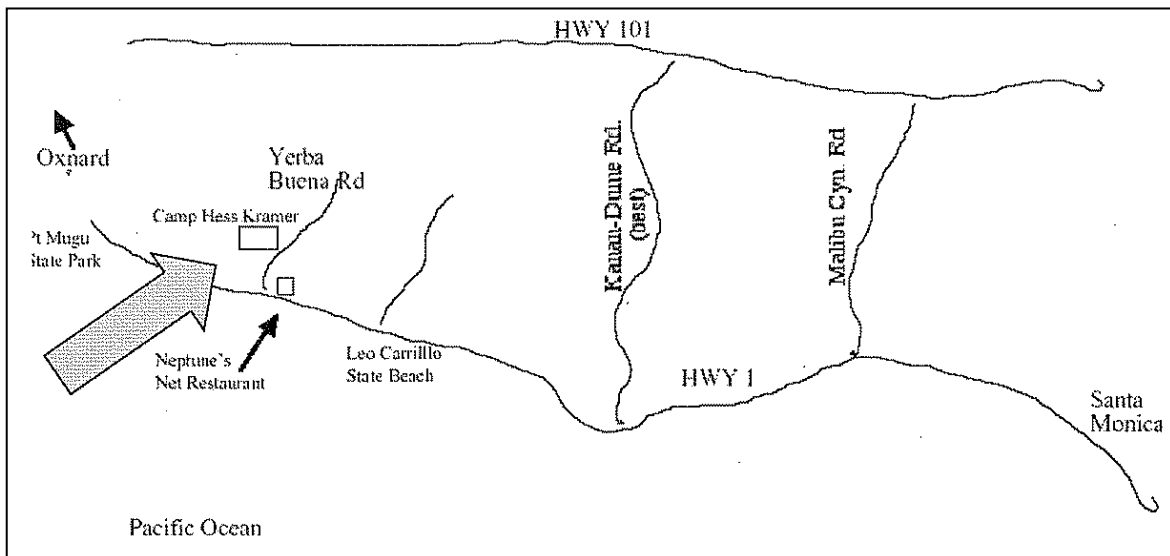

## Directions to Hess Kramer

**From the south and east:** Take 101 NORTH to Malibu Canyon Road or Kanan-Dume Road (recommended). Take Malibu Canyon or Kanan-Dume (best) WEST to Hwy 1. Take Hwy 1 NORTH past Pepperdine, Leo Carrillo State Park, and the Los Angeles/Ventura County line. You will soon come to Neptune's Net Restaurant on the right. Turn RIGHT at Yerba Buena Road. Camp Hess Kramer will be on the left side of the road a short distance uphill. Turn LEFT into Gate #2. (There should be AEOE signs directing you.) Go past the back side of the dining hall, curve left, go down a little hill and follow directions to park.

**From the north:** Take 101 SOUTH to the Hwy 1 SOUTH exit (Oxnard). You will pass Sycamore Canyon State Park, and approximately 3-5 miles past the park you will see Neptune's Net restaurant on your left. Turn LEFT onto Yerba Buena road. Camp Hess Kramer will be on the left side of the road a short distance uphill. Turn LEFT into Gate #2. (There should be AEOE signs directing you.) Go past the back side of the dining hall, curve left, go down a little hill and follow directions to park.

## What to Bring

**Gear:** Sleeping bag/pillow/blanket (bedding not provided in dorms), pajamas (dorms!), tent (if camping), flashlight, alarm clock/watch, towel, toiletries, ear plugs, warm weather clothing, sunscreen/hat, swim wear (for the ocean), cool weather clothing, rain gear (it does actually rain in So. California.)

**Other Supplies:** Maps—ours is just a guide! **Money** (cash or checks) for books, Acorn Naturalists, AEOE merchandise, and auctions; notebook and writing instrument; tape recorder for stories and songs; information on your program (brochures, etc.), job announcements, resumes for the job fair, journals, songbooks, etc.; **a mug** for beverages (disposable cups will not be available); stories and songs to share; Tecnu - if you go exploring, there is Poison Oak!

**Toys:** Camera, binoculars, field guides, musical instruments (drum circles Friday and Saturday night after bands, several music workshops, and other music jams often!), yoga mat, surfboards/boogie boards/wet suits (famous surf at County Line.)

**NO** cooking allowed on site (so don't bother bringing cooking gear with your camping gear); **NO** pets; **NO** illegal drugs.

## A Taste of this Year's Workshops

What follows is a description of the workshop strands for Building Foundations. Check the AEOE website for a list of workshops!

Building Foundations is all about preparing now for the future we imagine possible. This can be in regards to what students and teacher need, but also what we can be doing for the earth itself.

What are we doing now to get ready for the future we are hoping for?

**Diversity Strand (D)** "Building foundations of diversity" If we want to serve a diverse audience and have a better representation of the population in the environmental education field how are we going to get there? What are we doing now that will help us move in that direction? How do we address diverse audiences (race/ethnicity, age, socioeconomic strata, special needs, sexual identity and religion) and work toward common goals? How do we increase diversity among educators to better serve these audiences? Together we can work to come up with strategies to make outdoor and environmental education more inclusive.

**Natural History Strand (N)** "Building foundations of knowledge" Learning more about the natural history of science and nature builds a foundation of knowledge that future learning can build and grow off of. Learn more about the environment around you, including the natural history, native plants and ecology.

**Teaching Strand (T)** "Building foundations for more effective learning" Learn about and discuss teaching methods and strategies for the environmental education field, what works and what doesn't. Work on comprehensive and relevant lesson plans for your students. Workshops topics could include methodology, science standards, English language learners, pedagogy, scaffolding and teaching techniques for the classroom or the trail.

**Professional Development Strand (P)** "Building your own foundation" Investigate ways to enhance your career in Environmental Education. Work with other leaders in the outdoor and environmental education fields to share ideas about how to grow yourself and your teams and share strategies that have been proven successful at your site.

**Sustainability Strand (S)** "Building a sustainable foundation" Ensuring that we are working to create a sustainable future. Learn about sustainable living, communities and fostering sustainable behavior. Find ways to connect sustainability with students back at home.

**Recreation Strand (R)** "Building a well rounded foundation" Take a break, have some fun! Learn fun games to incorporate into lessons to teach cooperation, team building and effective processing. Stretch your legs! Take a break and spend some time running around.
